

BALANCE THE BUDGET, EQUALIZE THE TAX

Our present system of direct taxation and unrestrained government spending has resulted in levels of taxation far exceeding those resisted by our founding fathers. History has repeatedly demonstrated that liberty is at risk when free citizens are denied the ability to defend themselves against common criminals and political tyrants. The solution to violent crime is not to disarm law-abiding citizens, but for state and local governments to vigorously prosecute and appropriately punish violent criminals as well as corrupt politicians. Therefore, we will oppose all attempts on the part of the federal government to prohibit or regulate gun ownership by law-abiding citizens.

ENERGY INDEPENDENCE

Energy is the life blood of a nation's economy. Whoever controls a nation's energy controls its economy and politics. Oil is the world's currency in the 21st century, and we have been dependent on foreign oil for almost 40 years. Our government has only given lip service on the issue of energy independence, even though the United States has enough energy to supply our needs for generations with a surplus. If we entered back into the world oil market, the U.S. could conceivably be debt free within 10 to 15 years. ³
